Celebrating Our 20th Birthday! Come Join the Fun on Sunday, August II, 2019



The Dubois County Museum is inviting all to learn about Tying a Fly Fishing Fly with Joe "Swampy" Schoenbachler and friends at the

museum. Participants will try their hand at this age old art of fly tying and go home with several flies. About four to five artists will be teaching how to tie five or more different fly fishing flies that can be used for fishing. Come and learn as many different flies as you have time and skill for and stay as long as you would like. Stations will be set up in the museum for participants to move from one artist to another learning a specific fly that mimics an insect for fishing. This activity is open to all ages and abilities. The group will be available in the morning and then take a short lunch break when possible and then return in the afternoon. Admission to the museum will be charged. Admission is \$5 per adult, \$3 per high school student, \$2 per middle and elementary student, and free to those four years old and younger. There is no extra charge for the program.

A Local Person at Ground Zero

On display at the Dubois County Museum in Exhibit Room I is a case with a Rear Admiral's uniform that belonged to Dr. Ann R. Knebel. The case also holds Ann's khaki uniform, a white helmet, a mask and a small United States flag that she wore at Ground Zero in September 2001, where she volunteered to staff the first aid stations at the World Trade Center disaster site after the infamous 9-II attack on the towers in New Yo

Ann was born in Jasper, the daughter of

Ann was born in Jasper, the daughter of the late Clemens F. and Cornelia (Gehlhausen) Knebel. She attended high school at Marian Heights Academy in Ferdinand. She received her Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing in 1981 and a Masters of Nursing Science in 1985 from the University of Evansville. Ann earned her PhD in Nursing Science at the University of California, San Francisco, in 1990.

After Ann retired from the Navy in 2012, she became the Deputy Director of the National Institute of Nursing Research in Washington, D.C. She is the recipient of numerous awards and special honors including the Hubert H. Humphrey Award for Service to American and has twice received the Marilyn Hansen Meritorious Nursing Research Award. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing.

The Dubois County Museum is honored to display Dr. Ann Knebel's uniforms and items that reflect her service to our country. It is gratifying to know that a person from Dubois County played a role in restoring order after the horrific events of 9-II. Thank you, Ann Knebel, for sharing your role in history with us.

Artifacts from Southridge High School's 2017 Class 2A football state Championship are now on display in the Dubois County Museum's sports exhibit.

Included are quarterback Jayce Harter's jersey, wrist band with play sheet, and hand towel; running back Tucker Schank's helmet, jersey, and gloves; a Championship game football, a team photo, state champs medal, newspaper articles, and several photos, including one of the 2-point conversion pass from Harter to Schank with 1:22 left that sealed the 15-14 win over Woodlan. The items are spread through two display cases on the north wall of the sports exhibit. They are alongside memorabilia from other county high school team state champions – 1949 Jasper basketball,

Jasper's five baseball champs, 1999 Jasper tennis, 2001 Jasper football, 2005 and 2006 Forest Park basketball, 2001 Forest Park girls softball, 1998 Southridge girls basketball, and 2005 Jasper girls bowling.
