The wagon was restored by Kurt Vonderheide and can be viewed in Exhibit Room II -when not on parade. This farm wagon was made in 1903 by the George P. Wagner Wagon Shop in Jasper. The Wagner Wagon Shop was located on Main Street where Nordhoff Law Office is today. Kurt will be proudly pulling the wagon in the parade.
