Hearing him, the store owner Judy Rohleder challenged him to bring his artwork in. He did and that year he made \$800. His style is folk art. He does anything small up to storefront Indians. In August of 1990 Swampy began carving Santas. He produced a 25-year series of Santas. They can be found as tiny ones up to the 2-footers he has sold all over the region.

She states, "There are many organizations that need volunteers. I am grateful that so many volunteers have chosen to help the Museum". Every Tuesday brings a variety of challenges in Collections. They "take a trip down memory lane" as they have been called to check items brought in, as well as, to visit homes, basements, etc. for interesting items. COLLECTIONS SPOTLIGHT

41,300 Collection Items to Date

Norbert Krapf Collection

The Norbert Krapf Collection at the Dubois County Museum has more than 600 items. Since he is the former Indiana Poet Laureate, a number of the items are books of poetry that he composed. On November 10, 2018, he presented a reading at the museum from his latest book THE RETURN OF SUNSHINE which he said is his twenty-ninth book.

Norbert Krapf is a native of Dubois County and a graduate of Jasper High School. Active in Boy Scouts, he has given the museum numerous Boy Scout items including his Boy Scout Eagle Award that is on display in the Boy Scout Exhibit at the museum. He also gave the museum his Edward J. Rottet, Jr. Scout Award plaque that was presented to him in 1959.

Other donations include photos, documents and objects that belonged to Norb and members of his family that reflect their life in Dubois County. Norb lettered in football and baseball at Jasper High School, and there are photos and memorabilia of his school activities.

In 2917, IUPUI Archives transferred seven cartons of research materials used by Norbert Kraft in writing his book, FINDING THE GRAIN: PIONEER GERMAN JOURNALS AND LETTERS FROM DUBOIS COUNTY, INDIANA, originally published in 1977. The Krapf materials are stored in the John J. Fierst Library and Archives located in the Collections storage area at the museum.

Norb and his wife, Katherine, have been members of the Dubois County Museum for more than 15 years. He was one of the first presenters when the museum opened in 1999, and he has given presentations nearly every year. Many of his books are sold in the museum's gift shop including his book, FINDING THE GRAIN.
