#### Don't Miss Nov. 1st Cultural Program- *Dia de Muertos*

On Monday, November 1, The Dubois County Museum, located at 2704 N. Newton Street (US 231 North) in Jasper, Indiana will host an immersive cultural experience celebrating *Dia de* Muertos, which translates to "The Day of the Dead". This sacred feast transcends beliefs, education and borders. All are welcome to participate. It's a day to honor the people we love who have died.

The program will be from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the museum. From 5:00-6:00 p.m. Altars de Muertos created by community members and Latinx partners will be open for viewing. From 6:00-7:00 p.m. University of Southern Indiana **Professor Manuel** Apodaca will present: Day of the Dead: Celebration, Mythology and Tradition. The evening will conclude from 7:00-8:00 p.m. with a Latinx Dance Class with instructor Daisy Valdez-Perez and refreshments featuring traditional breads and sweets.
