The Dubois County Museum will soon have a new mural. In a cooperative effort between the Jasper Mayor's Youth Leadership Council (JMYLC) and the Dubois County Museum (DCM) board, a new mural is going up at the museum. The public is invited



to be part of the creation of the mural on May 14 and 15.

Elizabeth "Liz" Wertman of Blondebrush Design has begun preliminary work on the mural that will be painted on the outside west wall of the museum. The public is invited to join in the painting of the mural anytime during the times of noon to 4pm on Saturday, May 14 and Sunday, May 15 from 1:00-5:00pm. Participants can make a painted impression of their handprint on the mural. The completed mural will form a growing tree and words at the top will proclaim Growing Stronger Roots Together. The design offers three different shades of green to stamp the "leaves" and each color will be representing a virtue of our county such as "unity", "hard work", and "heritage".

Several activities are planned during the painting times.

The JMYLC has secured Food Trucks to be available both days during the painting. The schedule is Saturday-El Llano Taco Truck and Wood Capital Pizza. On Sunday Emerald Green and Wood Capital Pizza will be present. Maybe others.

activities. The museum opens at 10 am on Saturday. The popular Storytime program will be held at 10:30. Inside the museum crafts will be held, play sets out for the younger crowd, Little Pioneers area open and a special Scavenger Hunt available in the mural area.

The schedule repeats on Sunday in the same manner with one addition. **A Petting Zoo** will be set up in the park to the east of the museum for youngsters to pet rabbits, sheep, goats, mini horse, etc. belonging to the Lee and Danielle Schnell Family and others.


Heritage Days for Fourth Graders
