### **Bison Finds a New Home at Museum**

Early this spring, Mary Ann Champion from Vincennes University Jasper Center, approached the board about accepting a gift from them. They were willing to give the museum their Bison sculpture that was part of the Bison-tennial Public Art Project. It had been on display in front of the VUJC Student Center. The Bison was painted by Josh Dodd and has images of the Dubois Courthouse on one side and the Jasper Mill on the other side. Approval was given by the museum board and a new home is in the works to display this great piece of history from Indiana's 2016 Bicentennial. Our Property Manager, Kurt Vonderheide, secured approval from the Jasper fire chief and mayor to place the bison in the easement with the museum's new outdoor mural. Kurt plans to place creek rock and mulch around the bison and add other landscaping touches in that area. He also hopes to remove a rock path along the building and sow it in grass. We invite you to keep watching this outdoor space for improvements and additions.
