KWK out of St. Henry have been prepping the walls by pressure hosing off the dirt and the peeling paint and have been applying a clean and bright application of paint to the walls. Kevin of KWK started about two weeks ago and has the back of the building finished. He is now moving

on to the north end and giving that area new life. Paint colors are a light color to the top of the south wall and a taupe color for the most of the walls

The mural that graces the west side of the building will remain and plans are for adding several photos of the county's history to that west wall. The photos will be a nice size and can be viewed from the street. They will also be blocked off in a protective covering. The photos will be interchangeable and will be swapped out periodically.
