Miss Hagan was born in 1888 and grew up in Dubois County on the Pinkston Freedom Settlement, a black settlement, near what is present day Huntingburg Conservation Club. Her life is truly amazing as she was appointed as Ferdinand Post Office Clerk at a young age and was later named Ferdinand Postmaster. She also studied and completed training as a Pharmacist. Mr. Krapf has spent 14 years researching her life. In his new book he tells her life in poetry and will share his research on what she did after she left Dubois County.

His book is available at the museum Gift Shop and he will be on hand to sign them.
