Come and Explore the Museum

Has Cabin Fever and the cold temperatures got you tired of being inside? Stop in at your Dubois County Museum and check out all the exhibits. With over 50,000 square feet of exhibit space we have filled up the former Jasper Corporation building with wonderful items from Dubois County's past. Our Exhibit's team recently reconfigured the Natural Resources area. With the addition of a large display case given to us by the Dubois County

Courthouse and made and moved by Meyer Planing of Haysville, we are able to display our large collection of everything that comes from the earth. In the case we have a large collection of Uhl Pottery, brick making materials, and items from early cog wheels. A side of the case we have items from the St. Henry Lindauer Sandstone Grindworks. Check out the information on area coal mines, and the large silver smelter that lured

people to make it rich by purchasing a part of a silver operations. The Team has also gathered the pieces of fossils and early civilization and located them in this area. The pieces are all older than a two million years.

Around the corner from the exhibit, check out the 1930's Civilian Conservation Corp Camps that were located in Ferdinand and Jasper. Pictures and early descriptions of the camps and their work are displayed.

"Let's Go to the Movies"
